



GRESB Infrastructure Asset Certification Evaluation Form.

General Information

For a Infrastructure certification scheme to be recognized by GRESB, the scheme must first meet the 5 minimum requirements (Listed in the Infrastructure Asset Assessment Reference Guide document, Appendix 10) and is then evaluated based on a set of predetermined criteria and themes to establish the tier of the certification.

The evaluation process is listed below:

- 1. The 5 minimum requirements for a certification scheme to be recognized by GRESB are:
 - ESG performance focused, and certified at asset-level.
 - The assessment process and criteria document/information are available and robust.
 - The technical development of the scheme is overseen by a governance body.
 - The certification is based on technical documentation review and/or on-site assessment.
 - Assessment is conducted by an independent and qualified professional.
- **2.** Once the 5 minimum requirements are met, the certification scheme is added to the Infrastructure Certifications list as displayed in Appendix 9 of the Reference Guide document.
